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B. KEY IMPRESSIVE MESSAGES FROM OUR BENEFICIARIES



I am Sophia Mussa. I am here to share my story and thank the support I got from SHEEO which changed my life. I was raped in December 2020 by the son of our neighbor who was a friend to my brother at our home at Kisesa village, Kisesa ward in Magu district, Mwanza region in Tanzania. Through this cruel act, I got a pregnancy and was expelled from the school. The person who made me pregnant disappeared and refused to take responsibility of the child. No legal action was taken against him.

I felt very sad and I was ready to commit suicide as all my family members refused to support me and blamed me. I realized have no way out and my dreams to be what I wanted ended up there as I couldn't go back to school again. In the year 2023, I heard about SHEEO from the Village Chairperson that this organization is helping poor, young-mothers and help them with vocational skills training. I asked the village chairperson to help me get in contact with their office and then, I met with Ms. Gloria Rwegoshora, SHEEO Executive Director and explained my situation to her. Immediately I was offered a chance to be enrolled at Mwangaza Young-mothers Vocational Training Centre operated by SHEEO to learn tailoring, business initiation and soap making skills free of charge. From there my life changed as after training I was supported with a sewing machine to start my own shop and now I have changed my life and supports my child's education.



"We are very thankful for H.R.D.F Project as we were empowered on SRHR and Girls' bodily autonomy and now we are cooperating with girls' students to insure they can finish their education and protect them from any abuse." **Quote from Evance Mabula**, **Head boy and HRDF club leader at Kiswaga Secondary School.**

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D. ORGANISATION OVERVIEW

1. SHEEO BRIEF HISTORY:

Solidarity for Her Education and Empowerment Organisation – SHEEO is a grassroots young feminist non-partisan, non-profit and non-governmental organization striving to help rural adolescents' girls and young women thrive and become autonomous in rural Tanzania.

SHEEO was founded by a group of five young people from poor, rural families who survived different acts of Human rights violations when they were growing up. After their studies, they decided to come together and initiate this organisation to fight for the integral well-being of the impoverished rural adolescents' girls and young women in Tanzania.

This organization was founded on **April 11, 2020** and was called first **Awakening Horn for Inclusive Rural Development - AHIRD until February 13, 2024** whereby during the Annual General meeting of 2023 held on that date, the members decided collectively to change this organization's name and become "**Solidarity for Her Education and Empowerment Organisation – SHEEO**" purposely to make the organisation focusing solely on rural adolescents' girls and young women due to its success in this area.

The new registration certificate number of our organization is **00NGO/R/6939** enacted on **June 7**, **2024** by the NGOs Registrar of the United Republic of Tanzania.

2. SHEEO MISSION STATEMENT:

SHEEO has a sole mission and call which is " to empower rural adolescents' girls and young women to fight poverty, illiteracy, climate change, gender-based violence and discrimination through education assistance and mentorship, socio-economic empowerment, theatre and sports initiatives, advocacy and capacity building on climate change, women's rights, sexual and reproductive health and rights".

3. SHEEO VISION STATEMENT:

Through its interventions, SHEEO NGO wants to ensure rural Tanzanian adolescents' girls and young women thrive, become autonomous and lead their own development in an equitable society free from climate crisis.

4. SHEEO VALUES:

In all our interventions, SHEEO stands and adheres to the following core values:



- i). Annual General Meeting;
- ii). Board of Directors/Trustees;
- iii). Coordination and Operations Directorate.



E. ORGANISATION PROGRAMMES OVERVIEW

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SHEEO's work is *fully community-driven and owned* and the impact made is *thoughtful and sustainable*.

That is our approach to ensure we work with communities having power to think and decide on how they can overcome their problems/challenges and not planting our own solutions.

SHEEO's programs directly impact 8 Sustainable Development Goals in rural Tanzania as listed below:



F. ORGANISATION ACHIEVEMENTS OVERVIEW

1. HISTORICAL BACKGROUND OF SHEEO ACHIEVEMENTS:

After its first registration in August, 2020, SHEEO NGO (previously called **AHIRD**) took some months for mobilizing resources and making necessary preparations before starting implementing its activities and reaches its beneficiaries.

In January, 2021, SHEEO started its operations officially whereby in that year and due to big financial challenges, the organization managed to reach and support 10 poor, rural families, 10 adolescents' girls studying in public and private primary and secondary schools and 10 impoverished young-mothers in Magu district.

In the year 2022, the organization's scope of activities increased and was able to help **38** impoverished, rural adolescents' girls studying in two public secondary schools namely Lumve and Kitumba Secondary Schools, **2 academically gifted neediest girls** to join Kitenga Girls' Secondary School and **20 poor, rural abandoned young-mothers** to access tailoring skills at Mwangaza Young-mothers Vocational Training Centre under SHEEO in Magu district.

It is true that during those two years, the organization was facing a crucial financial challenges and things were completely difficult to handle as the great part of support were donated by the founder members of the organization, one off grant from The Pollination Project - USA and donations from few individuals and Compasio Global Child Advocates based in Canada and the USA.

2. IMPORANT MILESTONES MADE IN THE YEAR 2023:

During the year ended December 31, 2023; *we impacted lives of 1000 people* in Magu district, Mwanza region through the four projects implemented by the organization as outlined in this report.



G. ORGANISATION KEY ACHIEVEMENTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 2023:

As previously described, SHEEO **impacted 1000 people** through its **four core projects** implemented in the year ended December 31, 2023; we would like to share with you the key outcomes of each project in the stated year.

1. Supporting Her Education for Her Autonomy – SHEHA Project:

"The overall goal of this project is to support the access and successful academic completion of secondary education for the most underprivileged rural girls to help them drive changes in their lives and communities using the power of education in Magu district, Mwanza region."

In the year ended 2023, this project reached **50** most poor, orphans and vulnerable adolescents' girls studying at Lumve, Bukandwe and Bujashi public secondary schools with sanitary pads and soaps for their menstrual hygiene, scholastic materials(school bags, school uniforms, stationeries), food, remedial classes and psycho-social counseling support.

With the support offered, supported girls' enrollments and retention rates at school and



increased.

All the 50 beneficiaries of this project were promoted to next level of their studies.

2. Nurturing Talented Girls Leaders of Tomorrow- N.T.G.L.T Project:

"The overall project goal of this project is to support the rural, brilliant, neediest orphaned and vulnerable girls to access education in reputable private secondary/open schools public/private colleges and universities in Tanzania in order to prepare them to be leaders of tomorrow and change agents for both their lives and communities in Mwanza region, Tanzania."

In the year ended 2023, this project helped **12 neediest brilliant girls** to access their secondary education at a private school called Kitenga Girls' Secondary School based in Mara region, Tanzania and two Open Secondary Schools called The New Planet and Teachers Resource Centre both based at Kisesa ward, Magu district, Mwanza region, Tanzania with tuition fees, sanitary pads and soap, scholastic materials (school uniforms, school bags, school shoes and stationeries) remedial classes and psycho-social counseling support.

Finally, all the project beneficiaries accessed their schools and got a quality education and necessary skills which improved their academic performances and positioned them well to make their dreams happen after completing their studies.





3. Her Right to Decide for Her Future - H.R.D.F Project:

"This project overall goal is to empower 720 girls and boys in three public secondary schools and 90 key community stakeholders in three wards identified through organization of capacity – building training-seminars, mentorship workshop and sensitization meetings to help them advocate, promote and advance girls' bodily autonomy and sexual and reproductive health and rights in order to create a safe

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community valuing and supporting girls' right to decide on their bodies, life and future in Magu district, Mwanza region in Tanzania."

In the year ended 2023, the activities of this project took place at Bujora, Kisesa and Bukandwe wards, Sanjo division in Magu district, Mwanza region in Tanzania by reaching **720 adolescents'** girls and boys at Lumve, Bukandwe and Kiswaga public secondary schools and **218 community** development actors in these areas with knowledge and skills on adolescents' girls Sexual and Reproductive Health and Rights (SRHR) and bodily autonomy.

Through this project we strengthened leadership skills, self-esteem and power for poor, rural adolescents' girls to decide on their bodies, lives and future.



4. Mwangaza Discovery and Learning Centre- M.D.L.C Project:

"This project overall goal is to break the cycle of generational poverty to underprivileged, rural young-mothers aged between 15 to 30 years old by offering support and skills opportunities to enable them change both their livelihoods and children and become development actors in their communities."

In the year ended 2023, this project helped **20 abandoned and neediest vulnerable rural out of school adolescents' girls and young mothers** in Bujora and Kisesa wards, Magu district, Mwanza region in Tanzania with vocational skills training in tailoring and soap making.

The training offered under this project has enhanced economic opportunities and financial independence for reached poor, rural out of school adolescents' girls and young mothers as they initiated small businesses and manage them properly which ensured them to earn an income for their needs and those of their children.
